# Message from the Pastor



essage from **2** le Pastor The Lenten season is upon us. In the Christian church, Lent is a period of penitential preparation for Easter. In Western churches, it begins on Ash Wednesday, six and a half weeks before Easter. It provides a 40-day period for fasting and abstinence (Sundays are excluded), in imitation of Jesus Christ's fasting in the wilderness before he began his public ministry. Almsgiving, the practice of giving money or food to the poor and performing other acts of charity, is also encouraged. It is a time of reflection and growing closer to our Lord, Jesus. Some holidays come before we end Holy Week. The first is Shrove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday is when all the items used to make bread are used up and/or discarded. Thus, the church celebrates the annual Pancake Supper. The flour using yeast is a symbol of sin rising within the person. Scripture tells us that "false teaching is like a little yeast that spreads through the whole batch of dough!" Galatians 5:9 The Israelites were instructed not to use yeast from Egypt to Canaan. The 40 days, they wandered to get to Mt. Sinai. The thin wafer is used for unleavened bread at communion. ook Club Ash Wednesday – March 5, 2025 Ash Wednesday is a solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God. It marks the beginning of the penitential Lenten season. It is commonly observed with the distribution of ashes and with fasting. Eastern Orthodox churches begin Lent on Clean Monday and, therefore, do not observe Ash Wednesday. It was the practice in Rome for penitents and grievous sinners to begin their period of public penance on the first day of Lent in preparation for their restoration to the sacra-

ment of the Eucharist. They were sprinkled with ashes, dressed in sackcloth, and obliged to remain apart until they were reconciled with the Christian community on Maundy Thursday, the Thursday before Easter. When these practices fell into disuse (8th–10th century), the beginning of the penitential season of Lent was symbolized by placing ashes on the heads of the entire congregation. #### St. Patrick Day

St. Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint of Ireland and its national apostle. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at 16. He later escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited with bringing Christianity to its people. In the centuries following Patrick's death (believed to have been on March 17, 461), the mythology surrounding his life became ever more ingrained in the Irish culture: Perhaps the most well-known legend of St. Patrick is that he explained the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) using the three leaves of a native Irish clover, the shamrock. As we journey through this Lenten Season, let us sacrifice and give up one thing for these 40 days of Lent that hinders us from practicing penitence and reconciliation. Let

us come to Holy Week as renewed, revitalized, freshly anointed members of the Body of



#### March 24<sup>th</sup> is the last day to sign up for April Dedication.



When taking your flowers please leave the sleeves for the next week and use a plastic bag to transfer your flowers home. Care should be taken so that the altar cloths do not get drip marks on them. Please remove the sleeves and carry them to the back of the sanctuary before placing the flowers in your bag. Empty the water in the vases on the parking lot then return the sleeves to the vases on the altar. TIP: Largé zip-lock bags work really well. Thank you.
